### A Comprehensive Campaign for Lifesaving Programs

If only our pets could thank you, they would say: *Thanks for saving my life!* 

You've given our community's pets a voice and that **extra degree of love that saves lives**—every single day.

Every month thousands of pets arrive at the shelter or are at risk in the community. It's remarkable that so many of the 16,000 pets that enter the shelter each year from throughout Pima County can be cared for, protected, and in many cases healed.

While PACC's new voter-approved shelter provides a suitable space, we must rely on private charitable support to sustain the pilot programs that have helped bring the save rate to nearly 90%.

Programs like the pet support hotline that provides solutions and resources to help families keep their pets safe and at home. Last month, over 8,000 callers were served!

Simply stated, we need your continued help to sustain this progress and save even more lives. That's why I hope you will give to the Your Love Saves Lives! campaign.

Last spring, the Friends of PACC began to imagine what could be accomplished with a strong financial base to sustain these pilot programs for another two years. With the right funding we could save many more lives. (Read more on page 2)

With the generous support of our donors we could...

- Increase PACC's medical staff and purchase essential medical supplies and medications so PACC veterinarians can care for all savable pets.
- Expand PACC's Community Support Services to protect vulnerable pets, and give owners, fosters, and adopters the resources they need to provide compassionate care as a pet guardian.
- Enhance PACC's Foster and Adoption Programs so that the most at-risk pets can be saved and find loving adoptive and foster homes or rescue placements.
- **Bolster PACC's programs for shelter cats**, including systematic medical monitoring, enrichment, and specialized placement for non-social cats.

... and so much more.

We began by talking to community leaders and gathering support to turn this vision for sustained programming into a reality. Our plans grew into the \$5 million campaign called Your Love Saves Lives!

Next, our volunteers began to raise the funds. New campaign contributions for programs added to the generous, ongoing support from our loyal monthly and online donors have so far amounted to \$4.1 million – just over 80% of our goal!

It is time to broaden our appeal to the entire community and announce **Your Love Saves Lives!** Our goal is to raise \$900,000 in the next six months.

Please join us in this exciting effort with a donation to Friends. Your campaign gift is the essential key to reducing euthanasia, sustaining the programs that have helped bring PACC's save rate to almost 90%, and saving even more lost, injured, and vulnerable pets.



We have both worked long and hard for many years, and God has blessed us with wonderful children and a succession of wonderful dogs.

We decided to give back for all the love and fulfillment the dogs have provided – to pay it forward. Instead of leaving something to Friends of PACC in our will, we said 'Why not give today?'That way, we can meet the dire need and really get to appreciate the results of our gift.

So, we've made a contribution to Friends of PACC that has played a small part in the staffing and facilities you see here today, and we are told that a fourth vet has been identified to join Dr. Wilcox, Dr. Rios, and Dr. Wesley, so the gift continues its magic.

### Lovely's Legacy of Compassion

Lovely came to PACC after her owner intentionally doused her in gasoline and set her on fire. Over 50% of her body was burned. The community rallied to send her to a specialty vet and give her the best chance at life, but unfortunately, Lovely passed from cardiac arrest a few days after arriving at the new vet. Knowing that she is now pain free is only a small comfort to the vets, staff, and community members who cared for her so deeply.

While Lovely's case was extreme, the Animal Protection Officers at PACC get over 200 calls per month to investigate possible neglect, abuse, and cruelty. PACC will continue to answer the call, in every case, or every animal.

Donations to #SaveLovely have been used to start the Lovely's Fund for Neglected and Abused Pets. Lovely's Fund will help ensure that animals suffering from extreme abuse and neglect face no financial barriers to the best care possible. Please share her story with #LovelysLegacy.

### **PetSmart Charities Cares About PACC Pets**

PetSmart Charities, longtime supporters of Pima Animal Care Center, has made a tremendous difference in the lives of pets in need. With grants and in-kind gifts totaling over one million dollars, PetSmart Charities has donated dog food, bolstered PACC's adoption programming (including a van to transport animals to events), provided emergency relief for hoarding cases, and supported innovative pet intake and diversion to reduce shelter admissions—including funding of the Pet Support Hotline.

"We're committed to supporting both ends of the leash—pets and their owners," says Jenny Aho, regional relationship manager for PetSmart Charities, and that's just what the Pet Support Hotline does. Trained Pet Support staff answer over 8,000 calls per month,

with over 80% of callers in distress. This grant-funded community hotline helps pet owners with access to resources such as referrals for affordable medical care and training, information on pet-friendly housing options, spay and neuter clinics, and help networking lost and found pets.

The Pet Support Hotline helps pets stay in their homes or find suitable placement. The resources provided through Pet Support keep over 25% of the animals intended for surrender, out of the shelter—meaning families are staying together and the shelter is taking in fewer animals.

### Maddie's® Apprenticeship Program



Thanks to Maddie, rescue and shelter workers came from all over the country to learn from Pima Animal Care Center's progressive, nationally-renowned team. During the Maddie's® Medium and Large Adult Dog Foster Apprenticeship, participants learned how to create and/or expand the fostering program at their shelter, how to market fostered pets for adoption, and ways to get their communities more involved.

"Ultimately, we want to empower animal rescue organizations to make their foster programs successful. Something as simple as taking a dog out of the shelter overnight can work wonders for their behavior and, ultimately, their adoptability, too," said Kristen Auerbach, Director of PACC.

In addition to the invaluable programming from Maddie's Fund®, participants also toured PACC, met with staff, and learned about many of PACC's own life-saving programs. Tanna Riggs from Utah Valley Animal Rescue in Spanish Fork, Utah, was particularly interested in the PACC foster program that pairs orphaned kittens with memory care center residents, saying that the program could be game-changing for her shelter.

### Friendship Tip: Be a Friend to Orphaned Kittens

Here we are at the beginning of kitten season! In our warm climate, kittens can be born at any time of the year, but there is always an abundance starting in spring and lasting well into fall. During this time, orphaned kittens are brought to PACC almost daily. While they range in age from a few days to several weeks, these tiny guys and gals require a lot of loving care.

When you find a kitten all alone, be sure to step back for a moment and watch the area from a distance. There's a chance that the mother cat could return. If the kitten is in obvious distress, (such as being wounded, lying in the middle of the road, etc.) go ahead and remove them from danger. Wrap them in a blanket or towel and put them inside of a carrier or box. Keep them warm and either take them to an emergency vet in your area or to Pima Animal Care Center
